Currently, we only have a single Master. If the numbers look like we are going to need a split, then we will need to round up additional judges.

We're going to need for everyone to be "volunteers". Our usual friends that come out to help us by shooting, etc. may not be around since I hear it is a football weekend and deer season opens. So we will be counting on **you** all to make our test great!

A total of 474 dogs are qualified for this year's Master National. This event is not only for the handlers and dogs that are going to be in Virginia to enjoy. GETTING READY FOR THE MASTER NATIONAL



Make sure your dog is ready for Virginia. The Master National is right around the corner and it is time to start conditioning your dog for the big week. Be careful of the heat right now. Even the water is hot so be sure to train in the cooler times of the day.

Other suggestions to make sure your dog is prepared for problems that may arise in Virginia is to be ready for the ticks. I suggest that you apply FRONTLINE PLUS just prior to departing for Virginia, regardless of when it was last applied. Also, Lyme's Disease is prevalent in the area. If your dog is not vaccinated for Lyme's go ahead and vaccinate now and repeat in 3 weeks.
